Dear Students, Parents/ Guardians:

Welcome Back! The Preakness Early Childhood Center lunch service is offered daily for every Full Day student. Our daily personalized offerings are student friendly and nutritional sound that follow the National School Lunch Program as part of the New Jersey state school meals programs.

The delicious menu options are made fresh and packaged at Wayne Valley High School, then delivered to the PECC.

The PECC student lunches are pre-ordered from a monthly menu at <https://maschiofood.boonli.com/login>. ***This is only an online ordering site to place the lunch orders for your child(ren).*** Anyone that would like to order needs to register first before ordering. Use the PECC Registration Letter for instructions to register first before placing orders. The payments for the PECC delivered lunches ordered are paid through Wayne Public School's Foodservice Point of Sale system.

Every PECC school student is given a foodservice identification number with the last 6 digits being the personal identification number (PIN). The foodservice id number is created from their student id number and is used to add each student to an online parent/ guardian account in PaySchools.com.

You can prepay for meals and the funds will be deducted each time they purchase lunch. Prepayment is not mandatory but is strongly recommended. You may prepay by paying online or with check.

Online payments are available, go to the Foodservice web page at www.wayneschools.com and click the link on bottom right labeled Online Foodservice Payments. You can also type PaySchools Central.com in your browser to access the online payment page for Wayne Schools and save it to your Favorites. For your convenience you can use the PaySchools App on your phone. See the Parent Letter from PaySchools for instructions to create an online account. The online account & payment option enables you to view your child's recent purchases on line.

Foodservice account money remaining or owed from the previous school year(s) will be carried over to the following year. When a student foodservice account balance is negative, the students can charge a complete breakfast or lunch. Negative balance letters will be mailed or sent home with the student for the parents/ guardians. Any account funds owed must be paid to Wayne Schools' Foodservice Funds as per the District Charge Policy.

The PECC school is part of the National School Lunch Program.

The **Five components of a complete lunch; 1- Meat/ Protein Alternative 2- Bread/ Grain 3- Milk 4- Fruit 5- Vegetable**. To get a full, free or reduced lunch at the listed price, the lunch must include at least three of the five components. One of the three components taken must be at least a ½ Cup fruit and/ or vegetable to be considered a Full Lunch. If a complete lunch is not purchased, the items are sold A la carte. (separately)

Wayne Pre-K **school** features our **Hot Plate & Harvest Market** foodservice lunch specials. We offer a daily Fruit & Vegetable side dishes for the students to eat a healthy and complete lunch. The daily menu offerings include two featured entrées with a Hot and a Cold Lunch Entrée options.

Some other menu offerings include

- pizza, Salad Entrees, Sandwiches, Wraps, Breakfast for Lunch & Bento Box specials.

We also feature menu favorites like Local Outside Pizza, Local Farm Monthly Flavor specials, Recognition Cake Day, Healthy Heart Day, Lucky Tray Day and fun specials and giveaways throughout the year.

Wayne Schools' Foodservices/ Kitchens are peanut & tree nut free.

Maschio Food Services offers an inclusive SAFE menu program for students with allergies and food restrictions. The safest meal would be made from home with this being the next best option. Each individual restrictive menu is developed with our school dieticians directly with the school nurse and requiring a doctor's note. Safe menus must be resubmitted at the beginning of each school year for potential updates and changes.
